Property Taxes

Winter Tax Due Date is February 14, 2018

Property taxes are payable beginning December 1, 2017 and are due without penalty on or before **February 14, 2018**. Taxes can be paid from 8:00am to 5:00pm Mon.-Fri. at 227 East Lincoln, Reed City, MI 49677. A 3% late fee will be added February 15, 2018. Beginning March 1st, pay to Osceola County Treasurer at 301 W Upton Ave. Reed City, MI 49677.

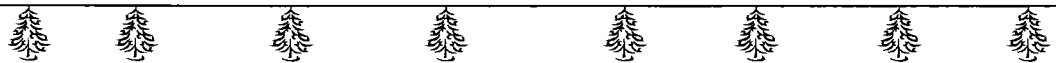

Accountability and Transparency

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS OF REED CITY WINTER PARKING BAN

The City of Reed City will be enforcing the parking ban starting November 15, 2017 and ending April 1, 2018. This prohibits the parking of any vehicle on any street in Reed City between 2:30 A.M. – 6:00 A.M., or any City owned parking lots EXCEPT in the designated 24 hour parking areas.

This is in accordance with Chapter 126, Sec. 8.30 of the City Code. Chapter 131 Sec. 10.106 of the City code provides for a fine of \$30.00 for each violation, plus an impound towing fee if necessary to remove the vehicle.

REMEMBER... There is NO PARKING throughout the Upton Street business district between 2:30 AM – 6:00 AM year round!!! The Reed City Police Department enforces these regulations, not only for snow removal by the DPW, but to also ensure clear streets for travel by the public and emergency vehicles.



Winter Reminders



Homeowners are responsible to keep their sidewalks clear of snow for pedestrians and mail delivery. No pushing of snow in or onto a sidewalk or street is allowed. You can help the Fire Department by keeping nearby fire hydrants shoveled out.

The Reed City Police Department will be enforcing all State laws pertaining to the operation of snowmobiles on the shoulder of City streets to allow access to the most direct route to and from designated snowmobile trails.
