Rental Ordinance

Ordinance No. 1441, passed by City Council on November 10, 2025

Effective January 1, 2026, all rental properties are to be registered with the City of Reed City. The cost to register a rental unit is \$10 and will be charged each time there is a change in tenant. There is a six-month grace period for landlords to register their rental units with fines going into effect on July 1, 2026. Details are available at reedcity.org or at City Hall.

Brush and Leaf Pick Up

The Department of Public Works will be picking up brush, grass clippings and leaves after the snow melts, on the 1st Monday of each month, until November. The following are some guidelines for pick up.

- All must be separated. i.e. different piles for brush, grass clippings and leaves.
- Brush must not exceed 4 inches in diameter.
- Must be stacked in the boulevard (between the street and sidewalk)
- Please DO NOT bag leaves, grass or brush.
- NO brush from tree removal.
- NO animal waste.

If these guidelines are not followed, your brush and leaves will not be picked up and are subject to fines.

Accountability and Transparency

In order for each city/village/township/county to receive State Revenue Sharing Incentive Program payments, they need to produce and make available to the public, a Citizen's Guide, Performance Dashboard, Debt Service Report, and a Projected Budget Report.
