Mid Michigan Community Action Receives Water Assistance Grant

Help is Available for Water and Sewer Bills

[Farwell, MI—] Mid Michigan Community Action Agency (Mid Michigan CAA) has been granted \$1.9 million for the Low-Income Household Water Assistance (LHWAP) program as part of the American Rescue Plan.

LHWAP can assist residents with water and sewer bills, shut-offs, and reconnection fees.

"Access to clean, running water and safe wastewater systems are critical for the health and wellbeing of our communities," said Eva Rohlman, Mid Michigan CAA Outreach Director. "We are thrilled to be able to expand this vital service."

Mid Michigan CAA expects to help more than 2,500 households over the next two years. LHWAP will be available until September 30, 2023.

Brush and Leaf Pick Up

The Department of Public Works is picking up brush, grass clippings and leaves starting the 1st Monday of each month until November. The following are some guidelines for pick up.

- All MUST be separated. ie: Different piles for brush, grass clippings and leaves
- Brush must not exceed 4 inch diameter.
- Must be stacked in the boulevard (between the street & sidewalk).
- Leaves also must be piled in boulevard (separate from brush and grass)
- Please DO NOT bag the leaves, grass or brush
- NO Brush from tree removal.
- NO animal waste.

If these guidelines are not followed your brush & leaves will NOT be picked up and are subject to fines.

- You have enough income to pay your future housing expense
- A qualifying event caused the delinquency, such as; Unemployment, Underemployment, Death, Medical Event,
- Divorce, or Significant Housing Repair Expense
