
Pocket Park Construction Zone








Hydrant Flushing

NOTICE TO RESIDENTS OF REED CITY WINTER PARKING BAN

The City of Reed City will be enforcing the parking ban starting November 15, 2025 and ending April 1, 2026. This prohibits the parking of any vehicle on any street in Reed City between 2:30 A.M. - 6:00 A.M., or any City owned parking lots **EXCEPT** in the

designated 24 hour parking areas.

This is in accordance with Chapter 126, Sec. 8.30 of the City Code. Chapter 131 Sec. 10.106 of the City code provides for a fine of \$30.00 for each violation, plus an impound towing fee if necessary to remove the vehicle.

REMEMBER... There is NO PARKING throughout the Upton Street business district between 2:30 AM - 6:00 AM year round!!! The Reed City Police Department enforces these regulations, not only for snow removal by the DPW, but to also ensure clear streets for travel by the public and emergency vehicles.







*All MUST be separated. ie: Different piles for brush, grass clippings and leaves

*Brush must not exceed 4 inch diameter *Must be stacked in the boulevard (between the street & sidewalk)

*Leaves also must be piled in boulevard (separate from brush and grass)

*Please DO NOT bag leaves, grass or brush *NO brush from tree removal *NO animal waste.

If these guidelines are not followed your brush & leaves will NOT be picked up and are subject to fines.

Accountability and Transparency

In order for each city/village/township/county to receive State Revenue Sharing Incentive Program payments, they need to produce and make available to the public, a Citizen's Guide, Performance Dashboard, Debt Service Report, and a Projected Budget Report.
