NOTICE TO RESIDENTS OF REED CITY WINTER PARKING BAN

The City of Reed City will be enforcing the parking ban starting November 15, 2023 and ending April 1, 2024. This prohibits the parking of any vehicle on any street in Reed City between 2:30 A.M. - 6:00 A.M., or any City owned parking lots EXCEPT in the designated 24 hour parking areas.

This is in accordance with Chapter 126, Sec. 8.30 of the City Code. Chapter 131 Sec. 10.106 of the City code provides for a fine of \$30.00 for each violation, plus an impound towing fee if necessary to remove the vehicle.

REMEMBER... There is NO PARKING throughout the Upton Street business district between 2:30 AM - 6:00 AM year round!!! The Reed City Police Department enforces these regulations, not only for snow removal by the DPW, but to also ensure clear streets for travel by the public and emergency vehicles.

Winter Reminders

Homeowners are responsible to keep their sidewalks clear of snow for pedestrians and mail delivery. No pushing of snow in or onto a sidewalk or street is allowed. You can help the Fire Department by keeping nearby fire hydrants shoveled out.

The Reed City Police Department will be enforcing all State laws pertaining to the operation of snowmobiles on the shoulder of City streets to allow access to the most direct route to and from designated snowmobile trails.

New Residential Waste

As of January 1, 2023 Republic Service will be providing trash collection services for the City of Reed City. The new rates are:

- Blue bags will be \$2.59 each or a pack of 10 bags for \$25.90(available at City Hall, & Shakers).
- Individual 96 gal tote/cart will be \$14.15/month.
 - Recycling 96 gal cart/tote
 - \$14.15/month.
- Special clean up charge will be \$2.44/month is billed to water bill.

The form should be mailed out to residents to fill out and send back to Republic Services. There is a copy on reedcity.org or at City Hall.

Brush and Leaf Pickup

The Department of Public Works is picking up brush, grass clippings and leaves starting the 1st Monday of each month until November. The following are some guidelines for pick up.

- *All MUST be seperated. ie: Different piles for brush, grass clippings and leaves
- *Brush must not exceed 4 inch diameter
- *Must be stacked in the boulevard (between the street & sidewalk)
- *Leaves also must be piled in boulevard (separate from brush and grass)
- *Please DO NOT bag leaves, grass or brush
- *NO brush from tree removal
- *NO animal waste.

If these guidelines are not followed your brush & leaves will NOT be picked up and are subject to fines.

Accountability and Transparency

In order for each city/village/township/county to receive State Revenue Sharing Incentive Program payments, they need to produce and make available to the public, a Citizen's Guide, Performance Dashboard, Debt Service Report, and a Projected Budget Report.
